- 3. Seek responsibility and take responsibility for your actions.
- 4. Make sound and timely decisions.
- 5. Set the example.
- 6. Know your employees and look out for their well-being.
- 7. Keep your employees well informed.
- 8. Develop a sense of responsibility in your subordinates.
- 9. Insure that the task is understood, supervised and accomplished.
- 10. Train your employees as a team.
- 11. Employ your team in accordance with its capabilities.
- 12. Set your priorities.
- 13. Take the initiative.
